



Beloveds of God,



What do you think is Jesus' hardest commandment? I know, ranking commandments is dicey business and

probably not something we want to take too far, but as we have traveled the way to the cross this Holy Week I have been struck by the absolutely INSANE amount of love that God poured into the world between his triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his death on the cross—let alone his entire ministry.

As we have journeyed to Christ's death I have heard the constant refrain in my prayers: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. As I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13:34) I think that might be the hardest commandment for me—to love as Christ loved us.

To love as Christ loved, just between his entry into Jerusalem and his death on the cross, would mean:

being served by someone at great cost to them (Mark 14:3)

defending that person when others accuse her (Mark 14:4-9)

hosting, serving, and sharing a meal with those you know will betray and abandon you (Mark 14:17-21, 26-31)

giving your body and blood for them (Mark 14:22-25)

washing their feet (John 13:1-11)

praying with and for them (Mark 14:32-42)

accepting the false accusations of those you worshiped with day after day (Mark 14:43-59)

telling the truth about the situation without insisting on your way (Mark 14:6-7, 18, 27, 35-36, 48-49, Mark 15:2)

being beaten by and for your accusers (Mark 15:16-20)

being crucified for those who, when offered the chance to grant mercy, instead chant "CRUCIFY!" (Mark 15:6-15, 21-37)

WOW! Right? Looking at this list it is clear that it is ridiculous to command us to love as Christ loved us, really. We simply cannot do it. We struggle to do any one thing on this list, occasionally—let alone loving this way all the time. Our current conflict and the ways it is manifesting among us mercifully shows us how utterly we fail to live into God's love for our neighbors. This is true for every one of us.

That is why God does not stop at this commandment. Jesus does not say this and sashay off into the sunset. If we could love as God loves us we would not need the crucifixion at all, we would just need a few really good stories about how God loves us or clear and detailed instructions about the mechanics of Godly love. Christ COULD sashay off while we, equipped with those, could set about perfecting the art of Godly love alongside Jesus (who we would certainly not have killed if we could love as God loved instead of feeling threatened by God's love). But we all know that is not how the story goes.

Christ is crucified, because we cannot love as God loves. This commandment is not a joke, but also God knows it is a goal we cannot reach on our own. So God does not leave us on our own. Instead the Word becomes flesh and dwells among us and when we can no longer tolerate God embodied among us and we kill Christ, God resurrects him and sends us the Holy Spirit. And make no mistake, God does not do this to enable us to keep the command to love as God loves. God does not die and rise again to be present in the world with us in order to make us good, better, or best versions of ourselves. God dies and rises again to be present in the world with us because that is how God loves—ridiculously, insanely, irrationally, and limitlessly.

Our lives are awash in God's love. It is the air we breathe. It is the bread we eat and the wine we drink. We cannot love like that. But we can open ourselves to be vessels for others to receive

### **February Financial Report**

The current general cash reserve at 2/28/18 (which do not include Temporarily Restricted Funds or Memorial and Trust Funds) was \$167k. This is 43% of the operating budget; comfortably exceeding a good guideline for cash reserves of at least 30% of the operating budget.

Offerings through 2/28/18 are \$176k. This is 60% of the budgeted offerings and we are 67% through the year. The total general fund revenue through 2/28/18 is \$248k.

We are 67% through the year. Our total general fund expense is at 52% of the full year budget. The largest expense line of Personnel is under budget at 52% of the full year budget - this is mostly due to the continuing unfilled CAT Director position. Facilities is also a large budget item that is under budget at 49% of the full year budget. This is mostly due to a large project (parking lot resurface) that is not yet expensed. Net general fund income for the period ended 2/28/18 is \$22k.






