Once upon a time Jesus was teaching in a



temple and a group of religious people came to him and brought with them a woman against

whom they had some accusations (adultery in this case). They said to him, "Moses said we can stone her for this! Can we?" Jesus thought about it and said, "Sure. Whoever is without sin can kick the stoning of this woman off..." Not a single person picked up a stone, instead they sort of quietly drifted away having had to acknowledge publicly that they themselves were sinners. Jesus then said to the woman, "What?! Where did everyone go? Is there nobody blameless enough to be able to condemn you?" The woman simply said, "No one, sir." Jesus (probably) smiled and said, "I don't condemn you either."

(John 8:1-11 paraphrased)

Beloveds of God.

I love this story. I love how Jesus stands up for a woman who is being publicly shamed. I love how he neither says that her behavior is acceptable nor accepts the public shaming and condemnation those faithful members of the community brought against her. I love how he says TO HER, "I do not condemn you," and how he models that to the community. And I love that he challenges everyone there, all those faithful and pious people, to look at their own sin. But more than anything I LOVE that all those people ACTUALLY DO IT!

Imagine what it would be like to be a part of a community like that! Imagine what it would be like to have the freedom to condemn someone and to choose, instead, to examine ones own complicity in sin. Imagine what it would be like to both name a behavior as inappropriate and also treat the person with dignity and respect anyway.

Imagine what it would be like to be a sinner who knows, absolutely, that she has sinned and can be condemned and then to have your community choose not to condemn you. Imagine what it would be like to mess up and wait for the stones to come but they never come. Imagine what it would be like to not have to hide your sin for fear of being stoned to death by the faithful members of your community. Imagine what it would be like to know that you are not alone in your sin and that that does not make it ok but also that it is not fatal.

That is the reality that the presence of Jesus Christ ushers in. That is the power of Christ in the world. This Easter season we celebrate that Christ is risen-alive and active in the world continuing to bring about abundant life awash in grace and filled with love. We are Easter people. We have a God who fills the world so completely with love and grace that we can't escape it, so totally that there is, and always will be, more than enough love and grace to cover all of the sin of the world. We live and move and have our being wrapped in the security of that promise, with God dwelling among us, and so we are free from the score keeping and stone throwing that would be necessary if grace and love were limited and needed to be rationed. But space in the family of God is not limited, ALL are welcome, so we do not need to compete for righteousness or celebrate others' unrighteousness.

God makes that which we imagine, and so much more, a reality. It is our blessing and joy that God invites us to participate in that reality. May we go boldly into the abundant life of Christ leaning not on our own righteousness and looking not to oth-

#### **March Financial Report**

The current general cash reserve at 3/31/18 (which do not include Temporarily Restricted Funds or Memorial and Trust Funds) was \$152k. This is 39% of the operating budget; comfortably exceeding a good guideline for cash reserves of at least 30% of the operating budget.

Offerings through 3/31/18 are \$193k. This is 66% of the budgeted offerings and we are 75% through the year. The total general fund revenue through 3/31/18 is \$273k.

We are 75% through the year. Our total general fund expense is at 58% of the full year budget. The largest expense line of Personnel is under budget at 58% of the full year budget - this is mostly due to the continuing unfilled CAT Director position. Facilities is also a large budget item that is under budget at 52% of the full year budget. This is mostly due to a large project (parking lot resurface) that is not yet expensed. Net general fund income for the period ended 3/31/18 is \$24k.
