Henri Nouwen, With Open Hands

This simple prayer by Henri Nouwen concludes his book, With Open Hands. In his reflections on prayer and the life of faith Henri contrasts the images of a clenched fist and an open hand: the journey of faith is the loosening of clenched fists that seek to possess into hands opened to receive. As he writes: "To pray means to open your hands before God. It means slowly relaxing the tension which squeezes your hands together and accepting your existence with an increasing readiness, not as a possession to defend, but as a gift to receive."

To live in light of God's promises means to open our hands to receive God's abundance. This is why the meal we call the eucharist, where we open our hands to receive the gift of Christ's nurturing and healing presence, is at the very heart of our worship and our life together as a community of faith. For once our hands have been unclenched to receive, they are open to share God's abundant gifts with those whose hands are empty.

Mt. Carmel's Journey FORWARD

Do you remember learning in school that a good story includes WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY and HOW? Mt. Carmel is shaping a new story that will guide the next chapter of our history, and all these elements are finally coming together!

WHO: <u>A Lutheran community</u>, rejoicing in Christ, growing in faith, active in love. (Our Shared Vision)

WHAT & WHEN: Our Strategic Plan (which outlines Strategic Areas of Focus, including specific steps and timelines for implementation)

WHERE: Our Strategy is "Sharing God's unconditional love by partnering with the community to serve the community."

WHY: Celebrating God's grace through worship, learning and service. (Our Shared Mission)

And now we are ready for......HOW.

As we implement our new Strategic Plan and work toward our mission and vision, **HOW** will we interact with one another? **HOW** will we function as an organization? We can all think of a time when a great plan was thrown off-course because of HOW well (or not well!) people worked together and got along. By paying attention to HOW we do things, we improve the likelihood that we will be able to accomplish our goals and grow our congregation. This is where our Healthy Habits come in.

Our congregation met several times over the past six months with the direction of Turning West, and as part of that process we collectively identified "unhealthy behaviors" that have not served us well in the past. Mt. Carmel's Journey Forward is a project to develop 5 Healthy Habits for interacting with one another and functioning as a congregation.

5 HABITS

Open to Change: At Mt. Carmel, we are willing to respectfully listen, support and advance ideas or actions that align to our shared mission and vision, realizing that change is necessary for growth.

<u>Listen to Understand</u>: At Mt. Carmel, we listen respectfully to all voices to understand with an open heart and an open mind.

<u>Intentional Evaluative Processes</u>: At Mt. Carmel, leadership will use processes that are intentional, defined and collaborative to determine outcomes, and to structure ongoing change.

<u>Accept Decisions Processed Well</u>: At Mt. Carmel, we accept decisions made using intentional, defined and collaborative processes that allow broad input to evaluate and express concerns.

<u>Loving Accountability</u>: At Mt. Carmel, we use Christ as the model of how lovingly to hold each other and ourselves accountable.

Like any other habit, these Healthy Habits will take practice. The more we practice them, the more likely they will become second nature and be engrained in our church culture. We will spend several weeks focusing on each habit, beginning with *Open to Change* in June.

Join us for the kick-off of *Mt. Carmel's Journey Forward* at the **Adult Forum on Sunday**, **May 5 (11 a.m.)**

In honor of Cinco de Mayo, we will provide chips, salsa, guacamole and lemon-limeade. You will have the opportunity to hear more about the 5 Healthy Habits and how they will make a positive difference at Mt. Carmel.




