In the words of this simple hymn we are reminded of the deepest meaning of the Lenten season: that in following the pattern of Christ's solitary sojourn in the wilderness we may be inspired to repentance. Repentance means more than remorse for wrongs we may have done; in fact, repentance is less about the past and more about a turning to God who opens up the future. In his Wishful thinking: A Theological ABC, Frederick Buechner writes: "True repentance spends less time looking at the past and saying, 'I'm sorry,' than to the future and saying 'Wow!"

But the amazing thing is that even this turning is the work of God's grace. As Buechner puts it: "To repent is to come to your senses. It's not so much something you do as something that happens." This is the promise of the Lenten season of preparation for the celebration of Easter: that as we turn – as we are turned by God – toward God's future revealed in the resurrection of Christ, we are freed to let go of all that binds us to the past.



ADULT FORUM, FEBRUARY 16, 2020

Twenty three people met at this forum to discuss the impact of the Food Bank (FB) on the food insufficiency problem in SLO County. Currently 47,000 people, or 1 out of 6, will go to bed hungry on any given night without the intervention of the FB. The FB is currently providing food to 30,000 persons monthly. That leaves 17,000 people who are unserved.

The group discussed many strategies that could be employed to help mitigate the hunger issue in SLO County. After much discussion they came up with the following strategies. MCLC will support the FB ten months of the year and will support Iglesia Lutheran in Santa Maria in Oct. and Nov. each year.

First, Steve Bennett will apply for four Thrivent grants over the next twelve months. Each grant is for \$250. On the first Sunday of each quarter we are going to take a second cash offering to match the grant amount for a total of \$2,000 annually. This will greatly help the FB because most of their donations come in November and December each year. However this works with us because cash enables them to buy product wholesale at one-third of the retail price.

Second, for those who do not want to shop, they can designate an amount <u>above</u> their regular tithe and designate it to the FB on the memo line of their check.

Third, for those who love to shop the donation schedule is as follows:

- ⇒First Sunday—canned fruit and vegetables
- ⇒Second Sunday—main dish meals, canned meat and fish
- ⇒Third Sunday—soup
- ⇒Fourth Sunday—cereal
- ⇒Fifth Sunday—pasta and rice

This type of organization makes it easier to shelve the items.

Fourth, for those who want to volunteer time, the first Friday of the month we will be filling dry bags for those who are near or homeless. The items will be in kind donations and will be handled assembly style. We need 8 to 10 persons who can meet at 1:00 and spend not more that two hours filling approximately 100 dry bags which will be taken to the FB for distribution.

Last but not least, we need three volunteers (we already have one) to pick up the food each week after church and deliver it to the FB on Monday.

Our God is an awesome God, but he also admonished us in Luke 12:48 that to whom much is given, much is expected. So we all need to prayerfully consider being part of the solution to this problem. Can we do any less?!?




