Wherefore, if Holy Scripture proclaims that God is love, and that love is

of God, and works this in us that we abide in God and He in us, and that hereby we know this, because He has given us of His Spirit, then the Spirit Himself is God, who is love. Next, if there be among the gifts of God none greater than love, and there is no greater gift of God than the Holy Spirit, what follows more naturally than that He is Himself love, who is called both God and of God? And if the love by which the Father loves the Son, and the Son loves the Father, ineffably demonstrates the communion of both, what is more suitable than that He should be specially called love, who is the Spirit common to both?

-St. Augustine, On the Trinity

In the coming days we will celebrate Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, who gives birth to the church. The following week is called "Trinity Sunday," dedicated to the Christian understanding of the triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The only problem is that both the concept of the Holy Spirit and the doctrine of the Trinity are probably the least understood teachings of the Christian faith. One of the early church theologians who reflected most deeply on the Holy Spirit and the Trinity was St. Augustine. Although the language of the passage above may seem a bit archaic and dense, and reflects some of the subtleties of theological debate in the early church, in essence what Augustine is saying is that the Holy Spirit is love.

What we celebrate at Pentecost and acknowledge on Trinity Sunday is that God is love – that God's love, embodied in Christ, through the Spirit, can dwell within our hearts and empower lives of love. This is the central message of the Christian faith always, but something that we especially need to hear and live out in this time of global fear. Even as await the time we can gather together physically we fulfill our Pentecost calling to be the Church as we practice and proclaim God's love.



A Note from Our Financial Secretary Retirement RMD's Cancelled for 2020

For the past several years, a number of Mt. Carmel members have transferred Required Minimum Distributions (RMD's) from their retirement funds directly to Mt Carmel in order to reduce their taxable income. For those who may not be aware, with the passage of the Coronavirus Relief Act in March, Congress cancelled the requirement for retirement funds to distribute RMD's in 2020. This eliminates both the distributions to Mt Carmel and the taxable income concerns about RMD's. We recommend that members affected by this change make donations direct to Mt Carmel. These will also be tax-deductible, something the RMD direct distributions did not allow.

REOPENING TASK FORCE UPDATE

While we do not yet have not definitive date for reopening our sanctuary for in-person worship, discussions are ongoing at the ELCA national, synod, and conference level. In addition to receiving ongoing updates from the Southwest Synod, we are also forming a Task Force here at Mt. Carmel, which, in consultation with the Council, will work on formulating plans regarding when and how we might resume worshiping in our sanctuary. While there is a deeply shared hope for a timely resumption of in-person worship, recommendations will be informed by the guidelines of the CDC, state and local public health officials together with the perspective our faith provides regarding our calling to care for the neighbor—especially those most vulnerable among us.
