In his poem, The Healing, Wendell Berry writes: "we clasp the hands of those who go before us, and the hands of those who come after us." As we prepare to resume our inperson worship in our sanctuary the image of hands linked together, reaching back into the past and forward into the future, is an especially appropriate one.

On the one hand, we are reminded that, in the end, the church is about people. Buildings do provide gathering places and centers for service, and we are blessed by the vision, commitment and hard work behind the creation and maintenance of our Mt. Carmel facility. But more than buildings, of course, it is the people—those gathered together and those who are ministered to—that matter most of all.

Just as we are linked to the saints who have gone before us in lives of service to God and neighbor, what we do today as the people of God reaches out to generations yet to come. Handing on the faith does not happen primarily through institutions or doctrines, as important as these are, but through the practices of faith embodied in human lives, person to person.

The image of linked hands can also remind us that we are not alone. Mt. Carmel Lutheran Church is a part of Christ's Church that extends beyond this place and time into the future and around the globe. That's really "our neighborhood." And through it all, we are reminded that we do not rely upon ourselves or our own competencies alone: the Church is God's and God's purposes will be fulfilled.

In his novel, Jayber Crow, Wendell Berry writes of a vision of the church as a gathered community reaching backward and forward in time, not perfect, but being perfected by shared compassion and forgiveness and God's sustaining grace:

My vision gathered the community as it never has been and never will be gathered in this world of time And yet I saw them all as somehow perfected, beyond time, by one another's love, compassion, and forgiveness, as it is said we may be perfected by grace.

As we prepare to gather together in person, let us give thanks for the ongoing guidance and empowerment of God's Spirit that even in this past difficult year, has continued to call, gather and enlighten us as a community of faith.


BACK LOT UPDATE

This year, the Southwest California Synod Assembly meeting will be conducted completely virtually. All attendees will join from the comfort of their own home or office to conduct the usual business and voting, including voting for our next Bishop.

Speaking of voting, two delegates—one male, one female—represent Mt. Carmel at the assembly. Marshall Pihl is our male delegate this year.

REOPENING TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Reopening Task Force (RTF) met weekly during May. Mount Carmel is resuming indoor worship on Sunday, June 6. For now, indoor worship services will require that all attendees be masked and distanced.

In our deliberations on resuming in-person worship and other church activities we have been guided by some fundamental values:

- 1. **Follow public health regulations** (CDC, California, County and local public health guidelines and Synod recommendations) for all church activities.
- 2. Love of neighbor. Follow practices in our congregation life that prioritize concern for the most vulnerable among us: the elderly, those with immune deficiencies, and children. This value is represented in the recommendation that even those who are fully vaccinated continue to mask and practice social distancing in our indoor worship.
- 3. Welcome all people. We seek to embody the value of inclusivity in our worship by not segregating people based upon their vaccination status. We promote the importance of getting vaccinated for COVID-19 while recognizing that some people cannot be vaccinated and others—including children—may not yet be vaccinated. It is also for this reason that we will continue with our outdoor worship where masking is not required.
- 4. Maintain a safe workplace for our employees.

 Mount Carmel is a faith community, but it is also an employer. There are issues of workers compensation related to a work-acquired illness. Most importantly, we want our employees to be cared for like we care for our own family members.

When we resume indoor worship on June 6 we will engage in the following practices:

- We will be physically-distanced outdoors and during worship.
- We will remain masked while indoors. The pastor and musicians will not have to mask when speaking or singing, but will be distanced from each other and from congregants.
- Chairs will be arranged in physically-distanced groupings. Please save the larger groupings for families or "social bubble" groups.
- The exterior doors will be propped open and fans on to increase air circulation. You may want to bring a jacket.
- There will be Children's Church; the details are still being planned.

- Communion will be celebrated using prepackaged communion kits.
- Offering plates will be at the rear of the church.
- The baptismal font will be empty and it may not be at the back of the sanctuary.
- Dismissal will be at the ushers' directions. Please be patient, use the center aisle and exit promptly to the outside.
- Coffee will be served outside. If there are baked goods, they will be served to you. Parents' help in directing their children will be especially appreciated.

We are finalizing a recommendation about the use of the Mt. Carmel facility by community groups. Next month we will work on the safety procedures for Vacation Bible School.

With the Governor's anticipated change in masking requirements, some questions being posed include whether unvaccinated persons will continue to be required to mask? And if the unvaccinated do not mask, either because they are not required to or because they do not follow regulations, what will Mount Carmel's response be? If unvaccinated persons are still required to mask, what are the implications for families with children who cannot be vaccinated?

These recommendations are trying to hit an evermoving target and will continue evolving in light of changing conditions. There are a variety of opinions about whether our medium term plan should be to:

- Maintain an indoor, masked service and an outdoor, unmasked service;
- Return to a single service, where all persons are masked until the pandemic is determined to be "over";
- Return to a single service where only unvaccinated persons are masked;
- Offer an indoor, masked service and an indoor, unmasked service.

For the short term, the outdoor, unmasked service will remain. There are pros and cons to each option. We do plan to continue livestreaming the service on Zoom for those who are unable to attend in-person worship.

The RTF is prepared to offer a Q&A session, either as a part of the annual meeting or at another time, as the council directs. We thank you for your understanding and look forward to being together soon.




