

Sunday Worship at Mt. Carmel Sunday Worship Service

9:30am-In person & Online

Easter, like Passover to which it is connected, is a spring festival. In the Jewish Passover Seder meal this springtime connotation is symbolized by one of the ritual foods – *karpas* – simply described as a spring green vegetable (usually celery or parsley). While the foundation of Passover is God's deliverance of the Hebrew people from bondage in Egypt, this liberation is reinforced in the turning of the seasons from the death-like character of winter to the new life of spring.

There's a similar distinction and connection between spring and Easter. Although the new life of Christ's resurrection at Easter is clearly more that the ever-repeating cycle of the seasons, still, the passage from death to new life reflected in nature is essential to the meaning of Easter.

Although the two are not the same, both Easter and spring are the gifts of the Creator of life, both call forth faith and both can teach us to perceive that all life is a miracle. In the words of a spring-time prayer:

Dear God we celebrate spring's returning and the rejuvenation of the natural world. Let us be moved by this vast and gently insistence that goodness shall return, that warmth and life shall succeed, and help us to understand our place within this miracle. Let us see that as a bird builds its nest, bravely, with bits and pieces, so we must build human faith. It is our simple duty; it is the highest art; it is our natural and vital role within the miracle of spring: the creation of life.

The San Luis Obispo County Jazz Federation will present a return visit of the New York City-based Ben Rosenblum Trio in concert on Saturday night, April 9, at Mount Carmel Lutheran Church. Ben is a young and innovative pianist and accordionist who possesses both immense technique and musicality in his playing. He was voted runner-up for Best New Artist in the 2020 Jazz Times' Readers' Poll. He has toured extensively in Japan, Canada and the USA. His long -standing trio includes drummer Ben Zweig and bassist Eduardo Belo. The trio delighted SLO audiences in 2019.

The show starts at 7:30 (with doors opening at 7:00). Tickets are priced at \$30 for general admission, \$20 for Jazz Federation members and \$10 for students.
